## **TREATING VILDLIFE** in a Veterinary Facility

Veterinarians treat wildlife that is brought to their veterinary facility by members of the public or by a wildlife custodian.



## Wildlife presented by the public

- **1.** Member of the public brings injured wildlife to a veterinary facility.
- **2.** Veterinarian examines the wildlife and provides emergency treatment.
- **3.** Once the injured wildlife is stabilized, the wildlife is transferred to a wildlife custodian for rehabilitation and/or release.
- **4.** A veterinarian may euthanize the wildlife if they decide that is the most humane course of action.

## Wildlife presented by a wildlife custodian

*A wildlife custodian is authorized by the Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry to care for and rehabilitate wildlife.* 

- **1.** The wildlife custodian contacts a veterinarian about the animal requiring medical attention.
- **2.** The veterinarian confirms the individual is authorized by the provincial government as a wildlife custodian.
- **3.** The wildlife custodian establishes a veterinarian-client-patient relationship with the veterinarian and presents the wildlife for veterinary care.





Guidance on the provision of veterinary services to wildlife is based on the policy statement from the College of Veterinarians of Ontario.
