



CVO Jurisprudence Exam CONFIDENTIALITY AGREEMENT – Test Taker

All candidates are specifically advised not to participate in any activity that could be construed as irregular behaviour. Irregular behaviour is conduct, in the College's opinion, which attempts to or is intended to assist any candidate to obtain a passing score by fraudulent means. Cheating during the test is considered irregular behaviour. Irregular behaviour would be subject to a report to the College for consideration of professional misconduct.

Disclosure or dissemination of the CVO Jurisprudence Examination test items to any person is considered a breach in confidentiality and in the security of the assessment items. All content of the test must remain confidential. Disclosure of the test items will also severely undermine the value of the test and adversely affect the validity of test results.

Failure to comply with the above advisement, will result in the candidate receiving a fail mark. The candidate may not re-write the CVO Jurisprudence Exam until the matter has been reviewed. The Registrar will refer the candidate's licence application to the Registration Committee to determine the appropriate course of action.
