



## Preamble

As members of a regulated profession,

who have a societal obligation to serve in the public interest, veterinarians earn and maintain the public trust through engagement in principleguided ethical practice. Veterinarians hold themselves, their colleagues, and their profession to a high standard of ethical conduct, reflecting the core values and principles of the profession. The College and the public have the reasonable expectation that the care and service provided by a veterinarian reflects these values. As societal ethics evolve regarding animals, veterinarians should take a leadership role to assure that such evolution is rational and sustainable.

## **Statement of Intent**

A veterinarian has a moral obligation

to animals, to society, to clients, to colleagues, to the profession, and to themselves. On occasion these obligations may conflict. In such circumstances, the Code provides a framework to guide veterinarians in ethical decision making. It reflects the profession's core values which provide the foundation for ethical principles and guidance on how one is to act as a morally responsible member of the veterinary profession.

## **Core Values**

**These values are the foundation for ethical care and service** in veterinary medicine. The core value of professionalism is defined in the College document Guidance on Professionalism for Veterinarians.

## **Ethical Principles**

Veterinarians act with compassion and demonstrate respect	<ul> <li>Recognize their duty to identify the interests of the animal in consideration of the circumstances.</li> <li>Strive to prevent and relieve animal suffering and improve animal health and welfare.</li> <li>Act with empathy towards clients and colleagues.</li> <li>Respect clients' autonomy, privacy and right to confidentiality.</li> <li>Treat clients fairly and without discrimination, ensuring that all animals are offered quality care regardless of their owners' background or circumstances.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Treat colleagues with dignity and respect, fostering a supportive and collaborative environment where every team member feels valued and heard. Colleagues include all learners, animal care partners, and members of the veterinary care team.</li> <li>Recognize the importance of self-compassion and personal wellbeing.</li> <li>Recognize and mitigate impacts to public health and environmental health.</li> </ul>
Veterinarians foster transparency and demonstrate trustworthiness	<ul> <li>Are accountable and truthful in their professional activities.</li> <li>Effectively communicate to promote and uphold professional relationships with clients, colleagues, and the public.</li> <li>Have open and honest discussions with clients that upholds the interests of the animal and ensures client understanding.</li> <li>Are reliable and competent.</li> <li>Maintain their competency by actively pursuing continuing professional development so knowledge and skills are current.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Respect diversity and provide care that is both culturally sensitive and appropriate, recognizing and valuing the unique needs and traditions of each cultural group.</li> <li>Support an inclusive and welcoming atmosphere that facilitates access to quality veterinary services for all patients, ensuring that no one is excluded based on their background or circumstances.</li> <li>Respect the special history and interests of Indigenous Peoples and commit to collaborative and respectful relationships with Indigenous communities, acknowledging their unique contributions and perspectives.</li> </ul>
Veterinarians act professionally and demonstrate continuing competence	<ul> <li>Demonstrate behaviours, attitudes and skills that reflect the core values of the profession and reinforce the social contract between the profession and the public.</li> <li>Collaborate with colleagues to ensure comprehensiveness and continuity of patient care when necessary.</li> <li>Maintain appropriate and dignified boundaries in client relationships and all professional interactions.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Adhere to legislated requirements and Professional Practice Standards.</li> <li>Engage in ongoing, reflective practice to develop knowledge, skills, and attitudes that are expressed in professional behaviour.</li> <li>Apply current knowledge and skills to the delivery of quality care and service and the advancement of veterinary medicine, animal welfare, and public health and safety.</li> </ul>
